The Position

Applications will be considered at the level of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, and Professor.

Responsibilities of the position include research and teaching in toxicology and environmental health. It is anticipated that the successful applicant will transition over time to a leadership role in the Interdisciplinary Graduate Program in Human Toxicology.

Examples of potential areas of scholarship for this faculty position include:

- Cellular/molecular/developmental toxicology with assessment of adverse outcome pathways
- Chemical risk assessment using in silico, in vitro and/or in vivo models
- Omics approaches, such as epigenomic or metabolomics, to the study of environmental contaminants

Laboratory space will be provided in the newly renovated Human Toxicology and Exposure Science Laboratory close to the College of Public Health Building.

Qualifications

Applicants must hold a PhD or other doctorate in a relevant science or engineering field. Additional expertise in pulmonary toxicology and/or exposomics is desirable.

For consideration at the Assistant Professor level, applicants must have publications in relevant peer-reviewed journals; show the ability to develop an externally funded research program, and future scholarship; and demonstrate experience, and commitment to, excellence in teaching.

For consideration at the Associate and full Professor level, applicants must have a commensurate record of publications in relevant peer-reviewed journals; demonstrated potential to develop and lead a nationally prominent, externally funded, research program

including current transferrable extramural research funding; and a commensurate record of teaching experience as well as a commitment to excellence in teaching.
