Postdoctoral position in Epigenetics and Neurotoxicology at the University of California, Davis

Postdoctoral position available immediately at the University of California, Davis co-mentored by Dr. Janine LaSalle (Department of Medical Microbiology and Immunology, School of Medicine) and Dr. Pamela Lein (Department of Molecular Biosciences, School of Veterinary Medicine).

Position Description: This position is funded by a recently awarded NIH grant to investigate the effects of environmental exposures on the epigenome in the brain and placenta relevant to neurodevelopmental disorders. The work includes exposing mice to PCBs during development, harvesting tissues, including cell sorting for microglia from brain tissue and macrophages from placenta, behavioral analyses, neurohistology, DNA, RNA and chromatin isolations, and epigenomic analyses.

Qualifications and applications: A PhD in a relevant field of study. In addition, the successful applicant must have experience with rodent models, either experience or a demonstrated willingness to learn epigenetics and bioinformatics, excellent interpersonal and communication skills, and a demonstrated ability to work with others in a collegial team atmosphere. Candidates should send a letter expressing their interest in the position and describing how their experience is relevant to the position. In addition, candidates should send a current CV that includes the names and contact information of 3 references.
